THIS IS AN IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL STRAND RESIDENTS - Update 10:

This is Update 10 for Hurricane Irma and its impact to the Strand Community.

As mentioned in yesterday's update, now that electrical power and water are back on at the Strand, we still may have "rolling" water outages due to sewage issues. This is because power is not restored to all County lift stations.

We also may experience some rolling electrical power outages for short periods of time due to energizing of electrical lines in other areas.

1. We are working on getting the back gate operational. It has suffered damage to the control wires and the contractor will be at the site on Monday to make the necessary repairs. The Front Gate is fully operational - Our sincere thanks to David on getting it operational so quickly and all his help during this recovery.
 2. Rick Tessmer sent some helpful advice regarding any devices with battery backup. Since power was out for an extended period, please:
 - a. Change the batteries in any wired smoke detectors that have battery backup. More than likely the batteries are completely drained.

b. Change the batteries in your thermostat, if it has them for backup.

Additionally, if you have a pool, don't forget to reset the pump timer for the correct time. This will ensure that the pump is not operating during the night hours.

**106 - Hurricane News Release - Mosquito Control Statement
9-17/17 11:25**

The Collier Mosquito Control District (District) is working to restore operations at its Naples Municipal Airport location and plans to resume treatment missions in the coming days.

The District reminds residents that:

- until electricity and cellular services are fully restored, not all residents may receive advance treatment notifications once the red, white and blue fleet is airborne again, and
- everyone should do their best to protect themselves from mosquitoes by using repellents containing DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus.

**100 - Hurricane Irma News Release - Emergency Need for Water
Conservation - 9/16/17 -11:45 AM**

"Collier County Public Utilities advises residents countywide of the critical need to reduce water usage. The wastewater collections system is at critical mass. Under no circumstances should residents be using dishwashers, clothes washers, or otherwise putting water into the sewer system. Due to the high volume of water entering the wastewater collection system, the county is experiencing sanitary sewer overflows across the county. If water usage is not significantly reduced it may be necessary to reduce water pressure or even temporarily shut off the water supply".

**93 - Emergency Need for Water Conservation - Residents Must Limit
Use -9/15/17**

"To avoid sanitary sewer overflows, conserve your use of water by limiting toilet flushes, showers, laundry or any other non-necessary usage".

**91 - Collier County Enacts Boil Water/Disinfectant Notice for ALL
Collier Water District Customers -9/15/17**

"This precautionary boil water notice will remain in effect until water system repairs and acceptable bacteriological testing has been completed. The testing is scheduled to be completed as water repairs are finished.

As a precaution, we advise that all water used for drinking or cooking be boiled. A rolling boil of one minute is sufficient. As an alternative, bottled water may be used.

Once satisfactory results have been received, you will receive written notification."
