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### **THIS IS AN IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL STRAND RESIDENTS - Update 12:**

This is Update 12 for Hurricane Irma and its impact to the Strand Community.

1. As previously mentioned, now that electrical power and water are back on at the Strand, we still may have "rolling" water outages due to sewage issues. This is because power is not restored to all County lift stations. We also may experience some rolling electrical power outages for short periods of time due to energizing of electrical lines in other areas.

Collier County has been at the Strand pumping out the sewage lift stations. Hopefully this will help everyone and they will lift the restrictions on water usage.

Cleanup along Strand Blvd is continuing with additional work to be done over the weekend.

**Please note that Collier County is still under a conservation of water advisory and that tap water must be boiled before using for cooking or**

**drinking. Once satisfactory results have been received, Collier County will provide written notification.**

**Collier County is still under an advisory to conserve the use of water to avoid sanitary sewer overflows. Please limit toilet flushes, showers, laundry or any other non-necessary usage.**

**A new Hurricane News Release was issued today regarding Collier County yard debris cleanup. They are now scheduled to start cleanup on September 22, 2017.** Below is an excerpt of the latest News Release in this regard:

### **115 - HURRICANE IRMA-RELATED YARD DEBRIS COLLECTION -9/19/17- 2 PM**

"Collier County's disaster recovery contractor, AshBritt Environmental, is set to begin Friday, Sept. 22, collecting Hurricane Irma-related yard debris. Residents are asked to place all Hurricane Irma-related yard debris curbside in the right-of-way as soon as possible. The right-of-way is the area of residential property that extends from the street to the sidewalk, ditch, utility pole or easement. If you do not have a sidewalk, ditch or utility easement in front of your house, place the debris at the edge of your property before the curb.

- Place storm-related yard debris in a separate pile.
- Do not mix yard debris with household trash or construction/demolition debris. Yard debris must be kept in a separate pile. Piles of yard debris mixed with other waste will not be collected.
- Do not put yard debris in bags. Only loose debris will be collected.
- Only stumps that are fully extracted and placed on the right-of-way will be collected.
- Do not mix normal yard waste with storm-related yard waste; only storm-related debris will be collected.
- Do not allow debris to go into drainage swales or driveway culverts since that can create blockages and inhibit drainage.
- Do not put household hazardous waste (paints, solvents, etc.) on the right-of-way."

3. Another Collier County News Release concerns hiring of contractors. Below is an excerpt from that news release:

### **117 - Hurricane Irma Recovery - Use Caution When Hiring Contractors to Perform Work -09/19/2017 4:30 PM**

#### **Use Caution When Hiring Contractors to Perform Work**

"Residents are urged to use caution when hiring a contractor to perform work. Residents should make sure they hire a reputable, licensed contractor

and are urged to hire the correct type of contractor specific to the type of work that they wish to have performed. Licenses for work are specific. For example, tile roofs require one type of license while shingle roofs require another. Residents are encouraged to contact Collier County Contractor Licensing at (239) 252-2431 or visit our website before hiring a contractor to verify the company's credentials.

Emergency repair work for the purpose of securing a building — such as enclosing doors, windows and roofs — does not require a permit at this time. All other repair work is required to have a permit. Roof repairs may only be performed by a licensed roofing contractor."
