#### **THIS IS AN IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL STRAND RESIDENTS - Update 13:**

This is Update 13 for Hurricane Irma and its impact to the Strand Community.

1. **Great News !! - As you my have heard, Collier County has lifted the Boil water notice and water use advisory.** Below are some of the latest news releases from Collier County. Additional and past releases can be found at their web site at:

"Collier County Public Utilities advises that while the need to conserve water is still important, the wastewater system has stabilized. Residents may use their dishwashers and clothes washers".

**Collier County Public Utilities Lifts Boil / Disinfect Water Notice  
 for all Collier County Water District Customers**

"The Collier County Public Utilities Department has lifted the boil / disinfect water notice for all customers of the Collier County Water District including Goodland and the Orange Tree.

A boil / disinfect water notice is still in place for customers of the Everglades City Utilities."

2. Below is an excerpt from a previous News Release:

**115 - HURRICANE IRMA-RELATED YARD DEBRIS  
COLLECTION -9/19/17- 2 PM**

"Collier County's disaster recovery contractor, AshBritt Environmental, is set to begin Friday, Sept. 22, collecting Hurricane Irma-related yard debris. Residents are asked to place all Hurricane Irma-related yard debris curbside in the right-of-way as soon as possible. The right-of-way is the area of residential property that extends from the street to the sidewalk, ditch, utility pole or easement. If you do not have a sidewalk, ditch or utility easement in front of your house, place the debris at the edge of your property before the curb.

- Place storm-related yard debris in a separate pile.
- Do not mix yard debris with household trash or construction/demolition debris. Yard debris must be kept in a separate pile. Piles of yard debris mixed with other waste will not be collected.
- Do not put yard debris in bags. Only loose debris will be collected.
- Only stumps that are fully extracted and placed on the right-of-way will be collected.
- Do not mix normal yard waste with storm-related yard waste; only storm-related debris will be collected.
- Do not allow debris to go into drainage swales or driveway culverts since that can create blockages and inhibit drainage.
- Do not put household hazardous waste (paints, solvents, etc.) on the right-of-way."

3. As you may know, a number of Florida Residents in our area, for example Bonita Beach and Immokalee, still do not have power and water to their homes or have suffered from flood damage, etc. and need assistance.

A number of residents have recommended various locations (listed below) if you wish to donate specifically for Hurricane Irma impacted residents.
